Who is the course for?

The course is for health and social care practitioners and other groups allied to the field of dementia care.

Our current student cohort includes nurses, social workers, occupational therapists, doctors, and other professions allied to healthcare. We also attract carers with an interest in developing their skills and knowledge; trainers; service managers; and increasingly, students from the voluntary and private sectors who recognise the importance of a specialist qualification and training. We have many international students, reflecting the worldwide reputation and status of the course. Crucially, you can study for this specialist qualification whilst continuing with your normal work role.

Structure & Content

The programme is part-time, online and therefore is a great option for those who are studying alongside work/family commitments.

Entrance Requirements

The programme is intended for experienced professionals from all relevant disciplines. Those who apply should have a university degree in a relevant field or equivalent. Evidence of extensive practice experience and previous study will also be considered.
