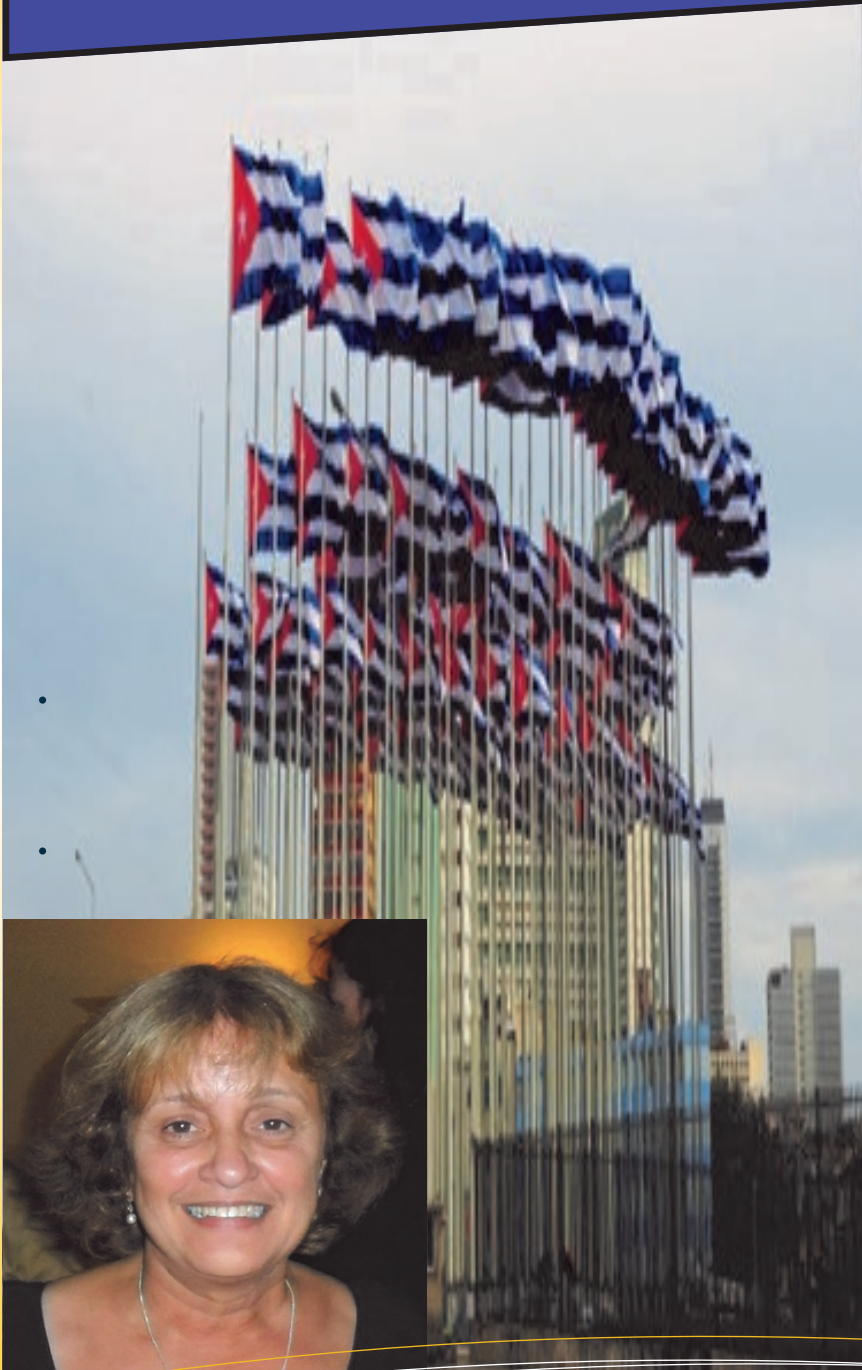

Sustainable housing is fundamental to human well-being, but the residential environment is also an acknowledged site of inequality in most societies. The environmental dimensions of sustainable housing have global resonance, while the notion of a sustainable home increasingly also embraces social and economic sustainability. Drawing on research conducted within Cuba, Professor Gonzalez will give an open seminar on Cuba's development trajectory with a focus on housing, the built environment and Cuba's approach to sustainability.

Professor Gonzalez is visiting the UK during August 2014 as part of a collaborative research project with the University of Stirling on the integration of social and architectural perspectives on sustainable housing, funded by the British Academy International Partnership and Mobility Scheme.
